- 2. Answer the following Questions:
- a. What are the five pillars of Islam?

Ans: A muslim has five obligations, called the Five Pillars of Islam. First is Al Shahadah: The profession of faith, there is no god but Allah; and Muhammed is the messenger of Allah. Second is Al-salat: Praying five times a day, facing the holy city of Makkah. Third is Zakat: Alms giving, which prescribes payment of fixed proportions of a Muslim's possessions for the welfare of the entire community and, in particular, for its neediest members. Fourth is Al- Sawm: Fasting during Ramadan days, the ninth month of the Muslim calendar, at which time Muslims abstain from food and drink from dawn to sunset. The fifth pillar is performing Al-Hajj: Pilgrimage to Makkah at least once in a lifetime. Al- Hajj is a gathering of millions of Muslims from around the world.

b. What is the third pillar of Islam and how does it calculated?

Ans: The third pillar of Islam is Zakat. This is calculated by how much wealth a muslim has.

c. Which is the fifth pillar of Islam and for whom is it compulsory?

Ans: The fifth pillar of Islam is Hajj, the Pilgrimage. It is compulsory for all Muslims who are physically fit and are financially Able to do Hajj once in their lifetime.
