Common Noun and Proper Noun

Noun: A noun is a naming word. It names a person, a place, a thing or an animal.



Common Noun: We use common noun for any person, place, thing or animal. It begins with a small letter.

Eg: doctor, park, umbrella, tiger

Proper Noun: A proper noun is a special noun for a person, a place, a thing or an animal. It always begins with a capital letter.

Eg. Dr. Rohan, Disneyland, Augustus

Singular and Plural Nouns

We use singular noun to name one person, one place, one thing or one animal.

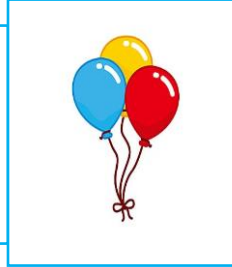
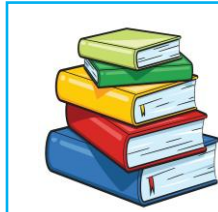
We use plural nouns when there is more than one.

Eg: book - books

balloon - balloons

flower - flowers

pencil - pencils



* We add **s** to a singular noun to make it plural noun. Eg: cup - cups

* We add **es** if the singular noun ends in **o, s, x, z, ch** or **sh**. Eg: box - boxes

* For some nouns which end with **y**, we write the plural by changing **y** to **ies**.

Eg: city - cities
